The regulation prohibits the export of these goods by post from 30 March 2020. It allows the goods to be exported in circumstances set out in the regulation, namely: • for personal use by a passenger or crew member in their accompanied personal or household effects; • by a person to a relative of the person, for the relative’s personal use; • by a humanitarian organization for non-commercial purposes; • by an Australian manufacturer of the goods; or • by a person who exported those types of goods in the course of their ordinary business and is registered for Australian Goods and Services Tax and has an Australian Business Number. By excluding movement by mail, shipments would have to transit via ways that are likely to lead to reports to the Australian Border Force (ABF). Customs Notice No. 2020/20, issued on 29 April, eliminates import duties on PPE and certain other medical devices. It allows for refunds of any import duties paid for the covered products on or after 1 February 2020, and provides for a free rate of duty on 31 July.
